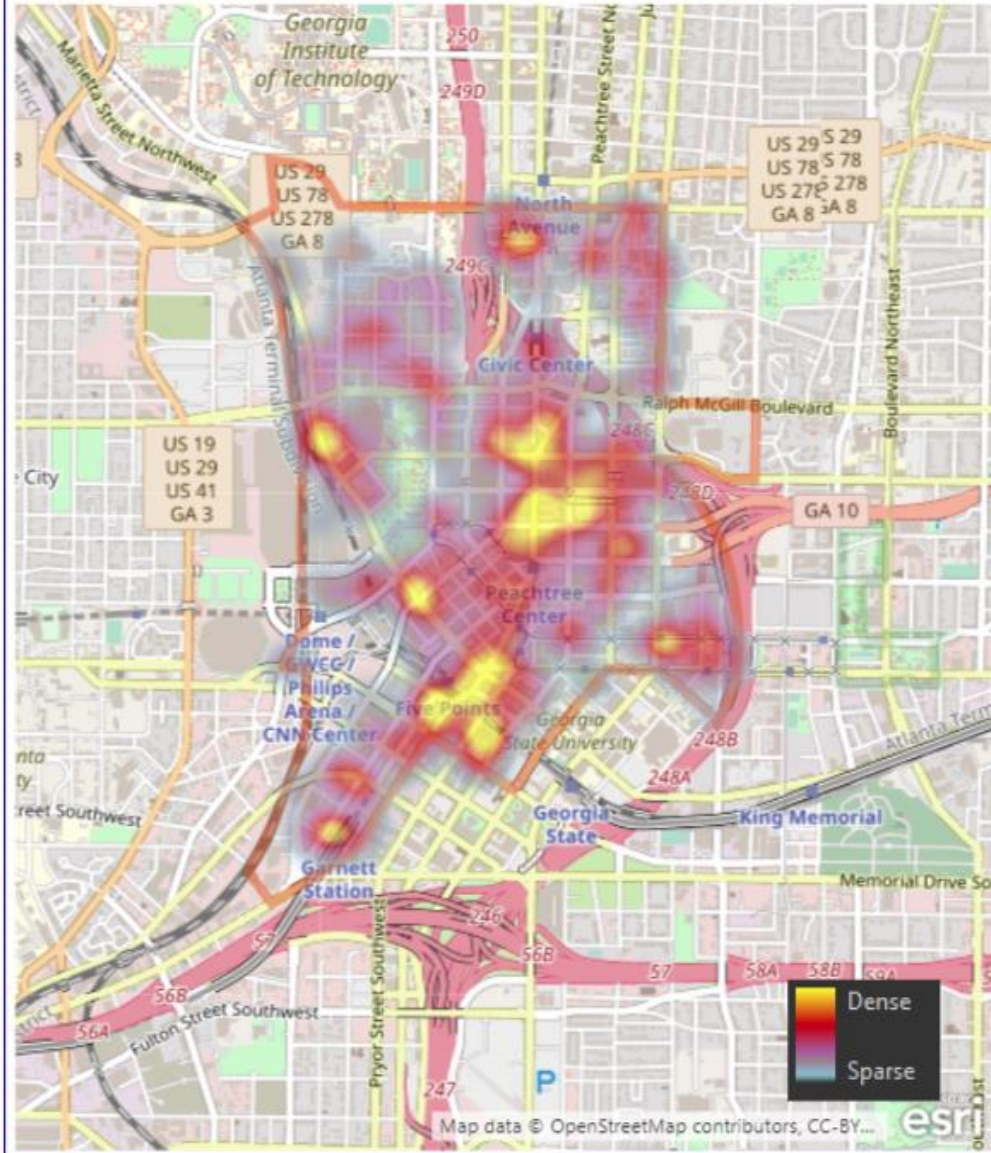

PART I CRIME MAP



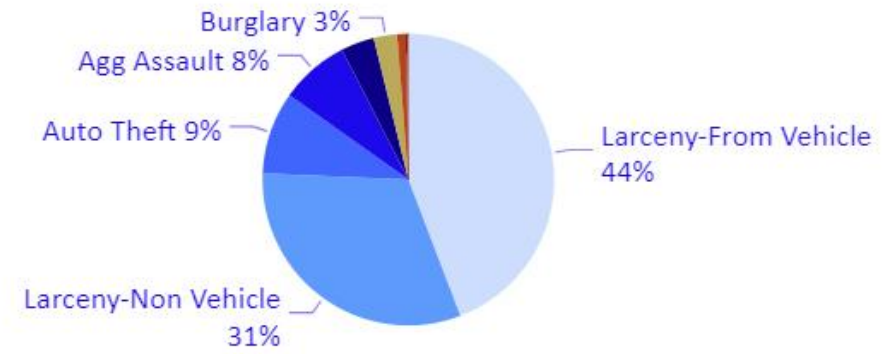

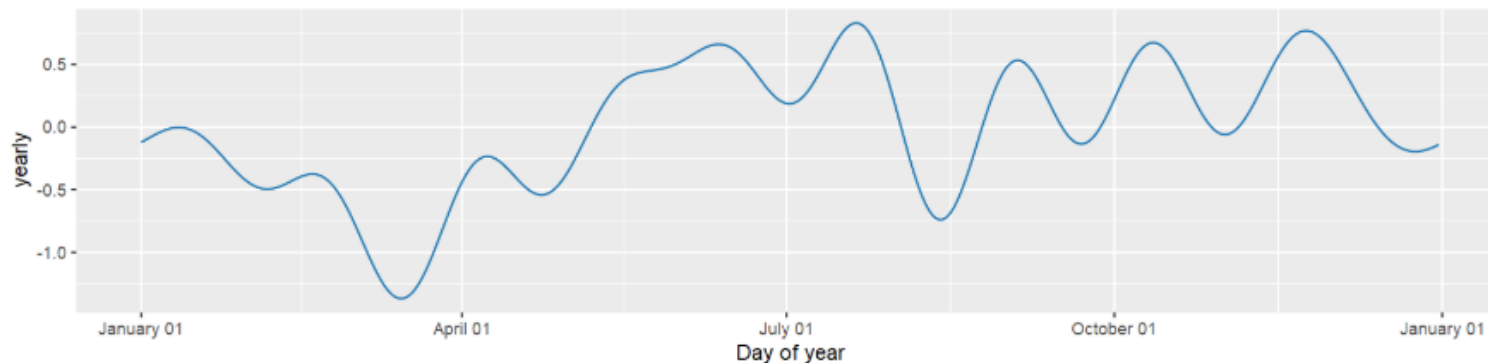
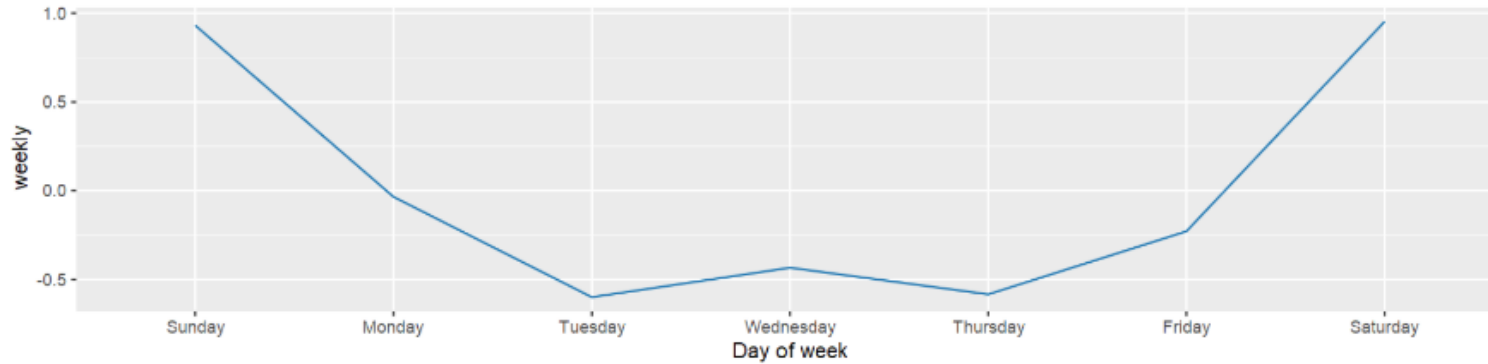
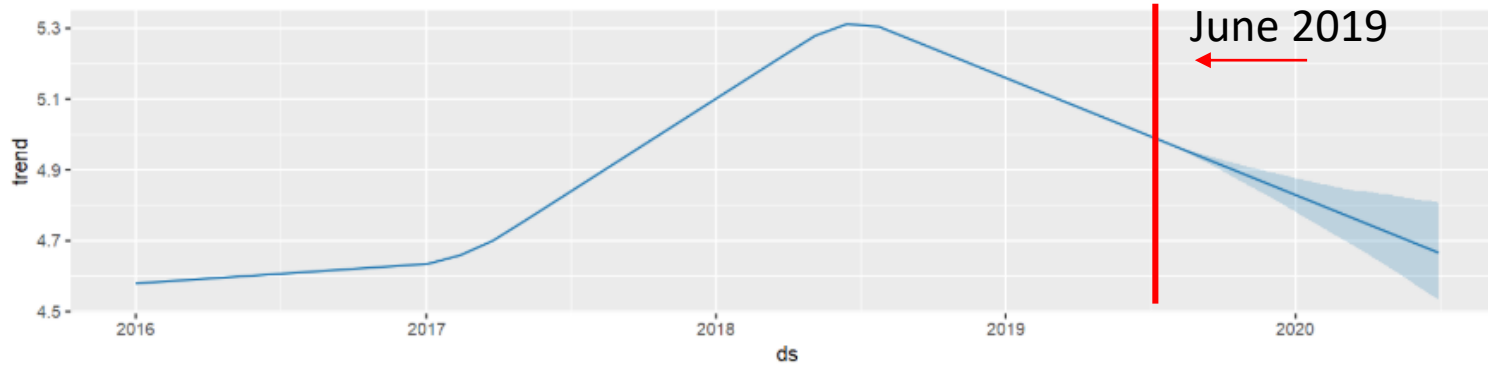
- Overall Crime down by 18%

CURRENT PART I CRIMES



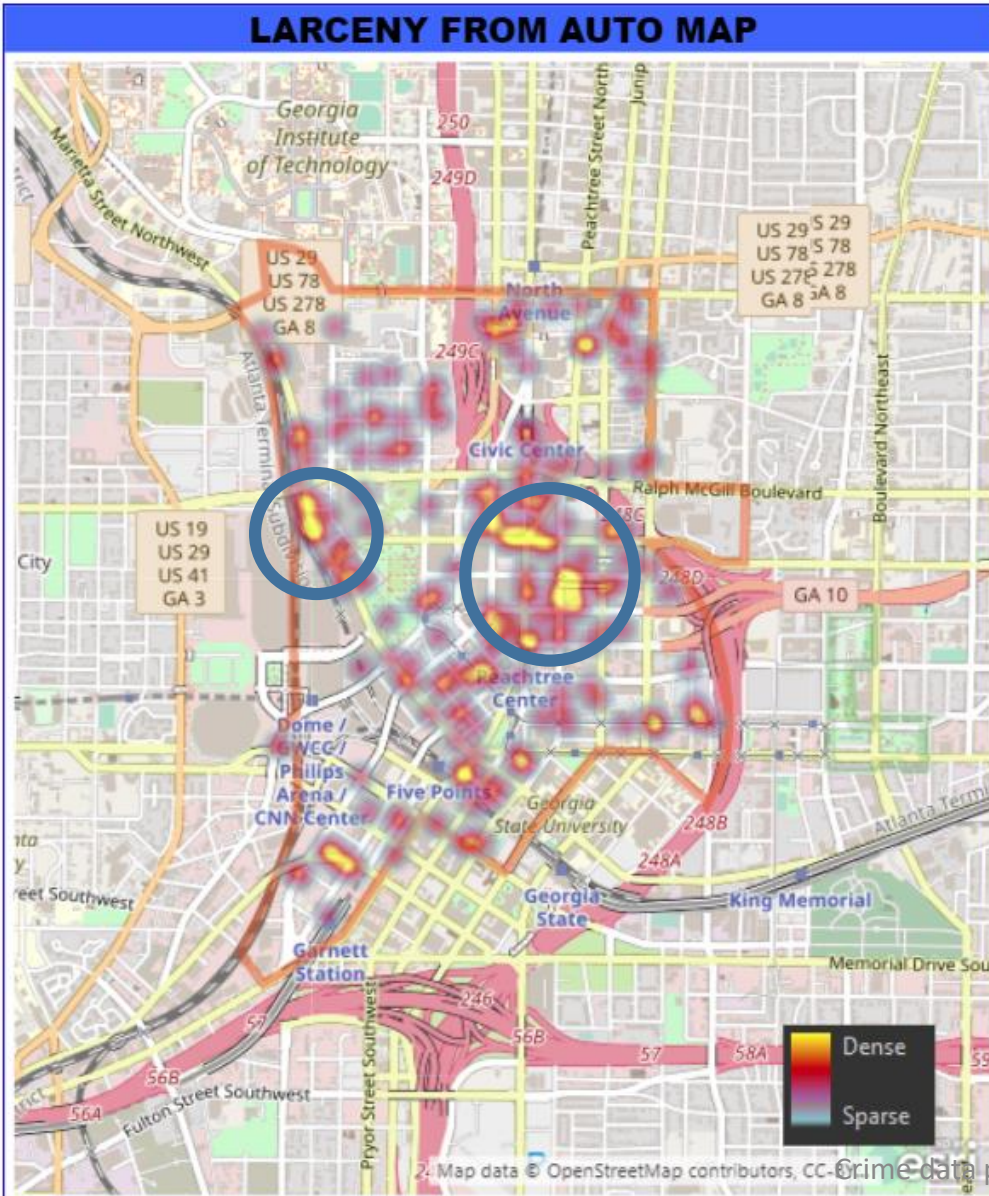


PART I FORECAST FOR DOWNTOWN IMPROVEMENT AREA



- Using historical crime data from 2016 through June 2019, forecast analysis show part I crimes trending down throughout the remainder of this year and into next year.
- Weekly analysis of crime since 2016 shows that Saturday and Sunday are high crime days.
- Monthly analysis of crime since 2016 show consistently higher crimes in the summer months, with large dips in crime in mid-March and mid-August

LARCENY FROM AUTOS • 2019 6-MONTH



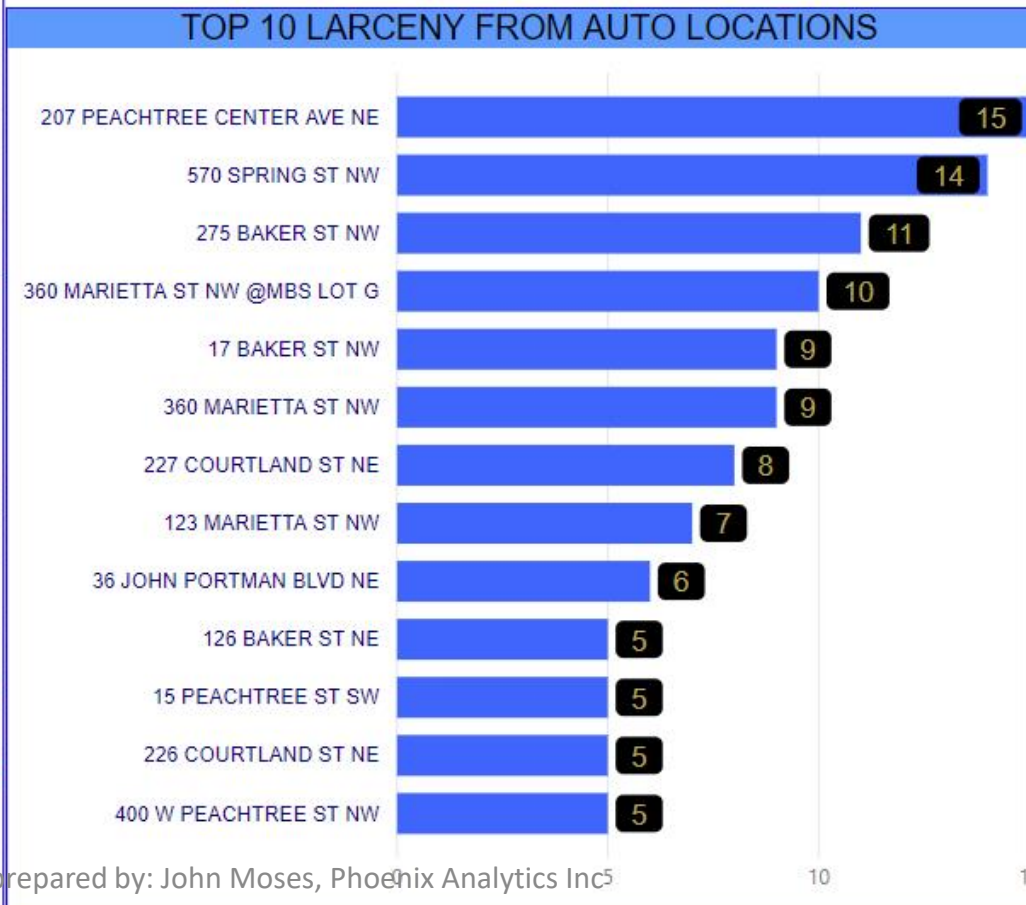

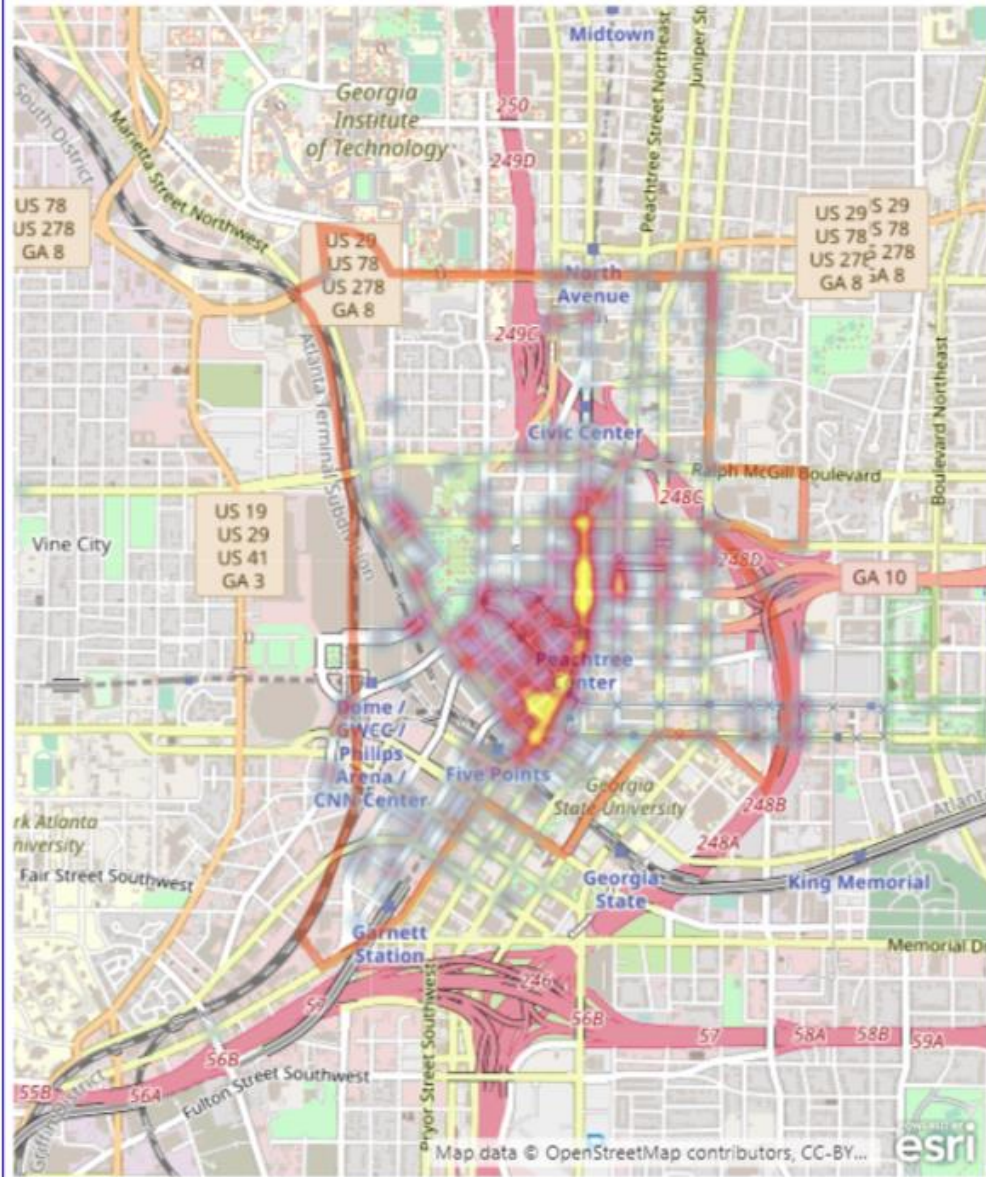


- The highest crime type in the ADID area is Larceny From Vehicles (i.e. car-break ins) totaling 358 for the first 6-months of the year.
- This is down 27% from the same period last year.
- The areas near the Georgia Aquarium and the parking lot at 207 Peachtree Center Ave have the highest density of car breakings for the ADID Area.

COMBINED ACTIVITY FROM AMBASSADORS AND APD



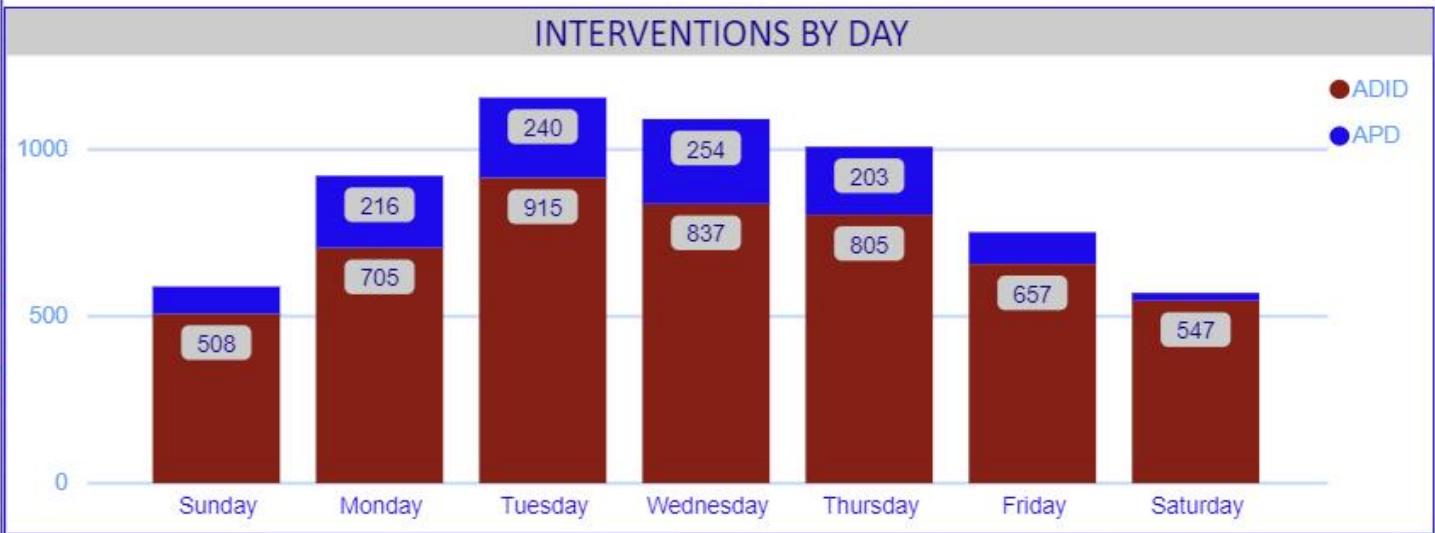
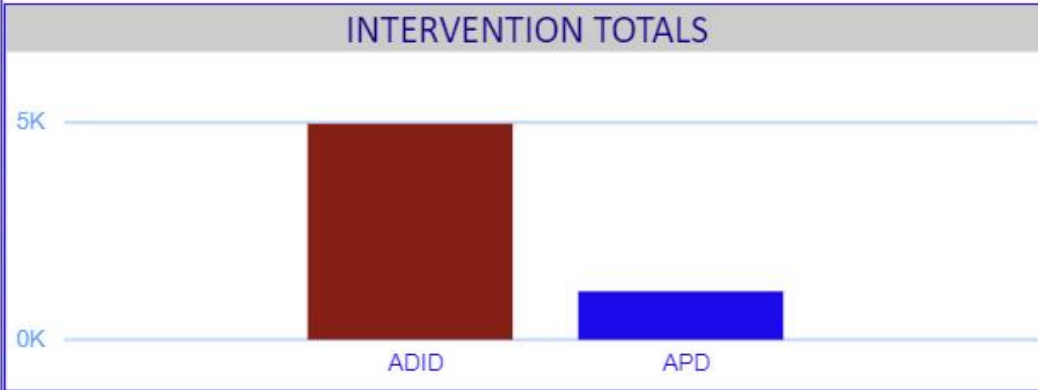
